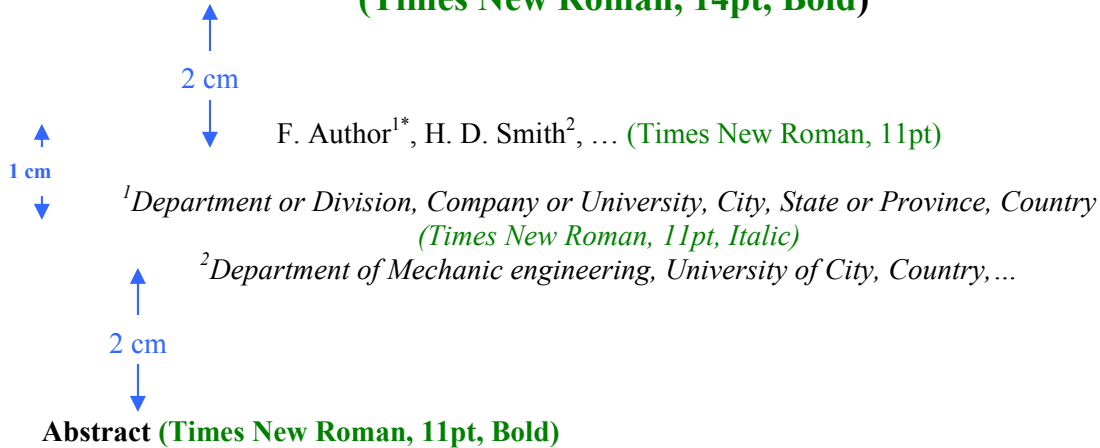


**Abstract Template for

← 3 cm → This document provides instructions for preparing an Abstract Template for The IIW International Congress on Welding & Joining. The abstract is a summary, which outlines the work to be reported, and includes as many of the results as possible. Abstract page must contains title, names, affiliation and contact information of the authors, short abstract and keywords and the logos in the page header and footer as shown. Other requirement such as margin and formatting are shown schematically. Since the proceeding will be distributed at the conference, therefore, it is essential that papers be delivered before deadline if they are to be included in the proceeding. Abstract should a maximum of 300 words (Times New Roman 11 pt), written as a single paragraph, having 3 cm left and right margins. The abstract should be a self-contained, capsule description of the paper including the motivation, problem statement, approach taken, results and conclusions.

1 INSTRUCTION

This document provides instruction for preparing full paper.

1.1 General Format

Please follow the guidelines below:

- Paper format: standard A4 (21 cm x 29.7 cm)
- Vertical typing area is 24 cm (for A4 this means top margin 3 cm, bottom margin 2.5 cm).
- Text (except for the first page) in two columns of 8 cm each, with an inter-column spacing of 1 cm.
- Horizontal typing area is thus 17 cm (for A4 this means left and right margins of 2 cm each).
- Justified text.
- Font and size: Times New Roman 11 pt, single line space.
- Do not include page headers and footers.
- Indentation: 5mm but only for first paragraph following a heading. This is easily achieved by using the style “Normal first” for such paragraphs.
- Page numbers will be added later to the document electronically. **Do not number the pages.**

2 TEXT HEADING #1

The primary text heading should be 11pt Times New Roman, bold, all capital letters, and flush left with the margin. If the heading is more than one line, the following lines should also be flush left. The spacing to the next heading should be one line.

2.1 Text Heading #2

The first sub-heading should be 11pt Times New Roman, bold, upper and lower case letters. The heading is flush left, and the spacing to the next heading is one line.

2.1.1 Text Heading #3

The third level of heading should be 11pt Times New Roman, bold and italic, upper and lower case letters, and italicized. The heading is flush left, and the spacing to the next heading is one line.

3 FIGURES, TABLES, AND EQUATIONS

Figures, tables and photos may be in color, but note that the printed proceedings will be in black and white so multiple data sets should be clearly identified with this in mind. Note that photos (e.g., SEM, optical microscopy and other photos) have a minimum 200 dpi resolution with suitable contrast. The book will be printed in black and white. Please print your final copies in black and white mode and then check that any color figures in your document are legible. If a graph has red marks and blue marks, for example, both will become gray when you print in black and white so do check that the reader won't get confused as a result. All figures should be integrated in the text and we suggest it is best to use the “inline” placement option in Word. A “figure” style and “figure caption” style are provided in this template. Note that text within the figures should have a font size of not less than 8 pt.

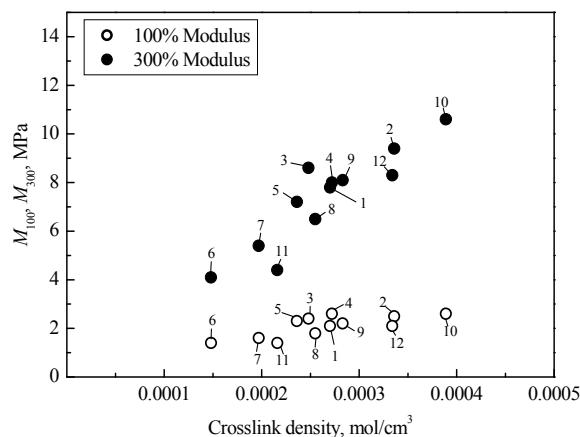


Fig. 1 Figure caption (10 pt, Times New Roman)

The table identification (e.g., Table 1) should be 10 pt Times New Roman, upper and lower case letters, italicized, and end with a period. It should be placed above the table. The table caption should follow the table identification and should be 10 pt Times New Roman font, upper and lower case letters and justified.

Table 1 Table sample (10 pt, Times New Roman)

| Value 1 | Value 2 | Value 3 |
|---------|---------|---------|
| 1 | 0.1 | 0.6 |
| 2 | 0.5 | 1.5 |

Equations must be 11 pt, Times New Roman and *italic*. For numbering equations, enclose the number in parentheses, and place it flush with the right-hand margin, e.g.

$$H=0.647 V \quad (1)$$

4 CONCLUSIONS

All paper should contain these sections:

- 1- Abstract
- 2- Introduction
- 3- Experimental Procedure
- 4- Results and Discussion
- 5- Conclusion
- 6- Acknowledgement (optional)
- 7- References

5 THE LAST SECTION: REFERENCES

References should be in the same typeface as the text. They should appear at the end of your paper and be arranged in order of appearance in the text. Within the text, they should be numerically identified using closed brackets. For example, to identify the first reference, use [1]. Examples for reference formatting are provided at the end of this document
